Earth-Life Science Institute, Tokyo Institute of Technology

The Earth-Life Science Institute (ELSI) of Tokyo Institute of Technology was launched in December 2012 as part of the World Premier International Research Center Initiative (WPI) of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT). The WPI grant is awarded to institutes with a research and administrative vision to become globally competitive centers that can attract the best scientists from around the world to come work in Japan.

ELSI's research mission is to elucidate how our planet was formed and how its early environment allowed for the rise of initial life and its subsequent evolution to complexity. What distinguishes ELSI from other institutes studying the origins of life is our emphasis on placing the study in the context of the specific ecological system of the early Earth.

By exploring both the origin and evolution of the Earth and the origins and evolution of life, we are creating a new field that we call 'Bioplanetology' and an interdisciplinary research hub for it.

- 1. Job Title: Professor (1 Opening)
- 2. Affiliation: Earth-Life Science Institute
- 3. Academic Field: Biology or Geochemistry. Especially those who have interest in studying the origins of life and early life.
- 4. Qualification Requirements:
- 1) Applicants are required to have a doctoral degree or Ph.D in the research field above.
- 2) Applicants should have original research concept to promote their own research by acquiring external or competitive funds for research in the field above.
- 3) Applicants should have the ability to supervise graduate students. Applicants are required to teach at the graduate level in English.
- 4) Applicants should have an international network in the research field and motivation to manage activities within Earth-Life Science Institute.
- 5. Rank: Full-time (tenured). The retirement age of Tokyo Institute of Technology is 65.
- 6. Salary: Following institute's staff wage regulations
- 7. Position Start Date: October 1st, 2016, or earliest date thereafter

- 5) Reprints or copies of up to five selected papers or books. Specify their citation numbers and the most significant article.
- 6) Summary of academic significance, not exceeding 2 pages of A4 or letter size.
- 7) Summary of the research and education plan, not exceeding 2 pages of A4 or letter size.
- 8) List of teaching experiences at academic institutions, class evaluation, classes conducted in English.
- 9) Names of four (2 domestic and 2 overseas) references (affiliation, postal address, phone, e-mail, and relationship to the applicant).
